The Year 3 Curriculum



In the Year 3 curriculum of primary education, our primary goal is to continue nurturing independent learners as they transition into Key Stage 2. A strong emphasis is placed on the development of fluency in reading, recognising that reading is the cornerstone of all learning endeavours. We believe that a child's ability to comprehend and access a wide range of texts is key to success across the curriculum. Daily reading at home is crucial for Year 3 children as it enables them to consistently apply essential reading skills, enhance their fluency, and expand their vocabulary. We kindly request parents to actively support this monitoring their children's reading at home and ensuring that both books and reading records are returned to school on a daily basis. We greatly value and encourage comments in the reading records, as they provide valuable insights into your child's progress and achievements in their home reading journey. In Maths, Year 3 focuses on consolidating and building upon the basic arithmetic skills acquired during Key Stage 1. This ensures a solid mathematical foundation upon which more complex concepts can be built. We recognise that mathematics is a fundamental skill that permeates various aspects of life and learning. Continuing to practice and master multiplication facts with speed, along with their corresponding division facts, will significantly

benefit Year 3 children in building a strong foundation for more complex mathematical concepts and problem-solving skills. These fundamental skills are essential for their academic growth and success in mathematics. Furthermore, Year 3 holds special significance for our students who follow the Catholic faith. During this year, they are given the opportunity to make the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. This spiritual journey is a major milestone in the life of a Catholic child, reinforcing the holistic approach to education we provide, which encompasses not only academic growth but also moral and spiritual development. We will be sending additional information to parents regarding the sacramental program, and we welcome any questions that you may have about it. Year 3 children can look forward to a multitude of opportunities to extend their learning beyond the classroom, including engaging trips that are closely linked to various curriculum areas, such as the exhilarating 'High Ropes' adventure at Stanley Park.
