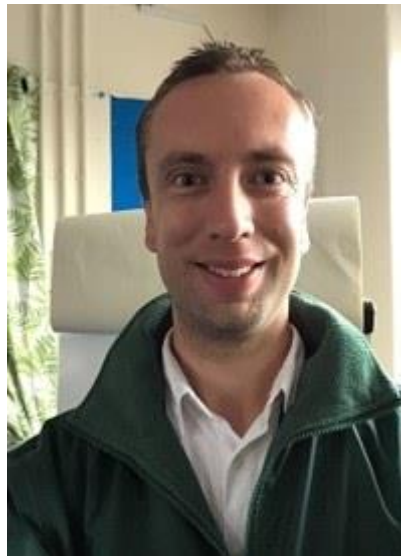




## Meet the Teacher - 2L

### *1 - The Year 2 Curriculum*

Year 2 holds a pivotal role in a child's educational journey. It's a year where foundational skills are honed and confidence soars and personalities emerge!

In Year 2 the pivotal role of reading cannot be overstated. As we embark on this shared adventure through English, fluency and pace are the key elements in Year 2. Reading forms the cornerstone of success across various subjects in the curriculum, as it provides the fundamental skills needed for effective learning. By developing accuracy and fluency in reading, children build a strong foundation that supports their overall academic growth. To foster this essential skill, it's important for children to engage in regular reading both at home and at school. The ability to read fluently opens the doors to a world of knowledge and imagination, enhancing comprehension across subjects and develop vocabulary acquisition.

Our curriculum empowers students with a strong foundation in mathematics, starting with an engaging introduction to simple fractions such as  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ , and  $\frac{1}{3}$ , as well as the fundamental concept of division. In the realm of technology, we ignite young minds with the wonders of computing through hands-on programming experiences, including the exciting world of Scratchjr where the children are introduced to the world of computer programming. In Science we look at habitats, plants and materials as well as other exciting topics. In History we look at Florence Nightingale, The Great Fire of London and The Plague and in Geography we continue what the children looked at in Year 1 - The UK, continents and the oceans of our world.

Education at our school extends beyond the classroom, as we believe in enriching experiences that shape holistic growth. Our annual trip to the Lytham pantomime in December guarantees laughter and enchantment, creating lasting memories. We're committed to providing immersive learning opportunities, exemplified by our science trip to Liverpool, designed to spark curiosity and ignite scientific inquiry. Embracing the outdoors, we've introduced outdoor learning at Stanley Park, where students engage with challenges, including high ropes courses, promoting teamwork and resilience.

Our curriculum continues to place significant importance on Religious Education (RE), ensuring its central role in shaping children's learning experiences. In Year 2, our children will delve into their RE

lessons by progressively narrating key events from the Bible, both orally and in written tasks. Throughout the term, Children's Liturgy takes place during the 11.15am Mass at St John Vianney, led by our school teachers. This allows children and their families to participate in Mass while the children engage with the Gospel on a level suitable for them in the Chapel. Fr Loughran welcomes families to Mass and then invites the children to join the liturgy and they are supervised and then return to Mass before the celebration for the Eucharist.
