3 - The Year 5 Curriculum

The Year 5 curriculum in primary school plays a vital role in nurturing children's growth as resilient and inquisitive learners. Equally significant is the emphasis on reading, as Year 5 students are encouraged to explore a diverse range of genres. This exposure not only enriches their language and comprehension skills but also encourages them to delve into literature with a discerning eye. Understanding the author's intent and making connections between different texts nurtures critical analysis and enables them to engage more deeply with written content. Additionally, oracy skills are given prominence, helping students effectively articulate their thoughts and ideas, a crucial skill that empowers them to communicate confidently and persuasively in various contexts.

We are excited to share that, in Year 5, your children will have the opportunity to participate in a residential trip to Hothersall Lodge. This unique experience places outdoor learning at the forefront, providing them with an environment that nurtures teamwork, resilience, and a deeper connection with the natural world. This adventure promises to be an enriching and unforgettable journey, aligning perfectly with our commitment to providing well-rounded and dynamic educational experiences for your children.
