3 - The Year 6 Curriculum

The Year 6 curriculum in primary education holds significant importance, serving as a critical stage in a child's academic journey. With an emphasis on preparing students for SATs, this year's curriculum is instrumental in ensuring children are "secondary ready." The comprehensive learning experiences provided during Year 6 not only impart essential subject knowledge but also help to develop a range of skills. By engaging pupils in problem-solving and reasoning exercises in Mathematics, they are equipped with the tools to approach complex challenges systematically. This not only bolsters their mathematical abilities but also nurtures a resilient and determined mindset. Our curriculum also places a spotlight on English, nurturing young authors through exposure to various literary genres. This exposure not only enhances their writing skills but also develops critical thinking and communication abilities, aligning perfectly with the broader goals of secondary education preparedness. To this end, it is crucial for children to read regularly, both in school and out, and to practise key arithmetic skills and times tables knowledge.

Furthermore, the Year 6 curriculum plays a pivotal role in fostering positive attitudes towards learning and empowering pupils to take ownership of their educational journey. The integration of metacognitive strategies encourages children to reflect on their learning processes, understand their strengths, and identify areas for improvement. This self-awareness instills a sense of responsibility, enabling them to set and achieve goals effectively. Such an approach also builds resilience, a crucial trait for navigating the challenges of secondary education and beyond.

In Year 6, the children are in for an exciting array of educational adventures, including a whole-school outing to the Pantomime! We will also have a selection of visitors into school, and local area trips to ensure children are exposed to a range of experiences. Additionally, they will be invited on a

residential visit which will play a pivotal role in enhancing pupils' cultural capital and overall personal development. This learning beyond the classroom will provide pupils with a unique opportunity to explore new environments, engage with different communities, and broaden their horizons. As in previous Years, the children will also be given the opportunity to experience outdoor learning activities, including a visit to the High Ropes course and water sports at Stanley Park.
